The Legacy of George Cadle Price



Around the world, people celebrate the new year with the hope of a better future as the start of new beginnings. While many people will reach their goals and find the inner leader in themselves this year, we remind Galen Eagles to appreciate the first leaders that fought for independence-the freedom of our country from the United Kingdom's control. The birth of Belize was a formidable journey led by the now Late Right Honorable George Cadle Price. Price was born on January 15, 1919, in Belize City. George Price would co-found the People's United Party in 1950 and become the first Premier of Belize in 1964. As the first Premier, George Price began the journey towards independence. On September 21, 1981, Belize, a jewel in the Caribbean became an independent country, and Price would serve as the first Prime Minister of a young Belize. By leading Belize to independence, George Cadle Price accomplished one of the greatest achievements for Belizeans- placing the sovereign power of the country in the people's will. In essence, George Cadle Price devoted his life to serving Belizeans and developing our country into a prosperous place for the next generation of Belizean leaders.

Since September 21, 1981, George Cadle Price was known for leading the path to Belize's independence. Price became the father of the nation and served as Prime Minister for two terms. In 2000, George Cadle Price was the first person to receive the Order of National Hero-the highest honor in the country. The Right Honorable George Cadle Price contributed so much to Belize but passed away on September 19, 2011. Nevertheless, the father of the nation would forever be remembered for his achievements and dedication to our country. In 2021, the Government of Belize declared January 15th a public and bank holiday in the honor of George Cadle Price. Notably, Galen University collaborated with the Ministry of the Public Service, Constitutional and Political Reform to devote a scholarship named after George Cadle Price which would be offered to the hardworking public officers of this country every two years. In essence, George Price continues to make a difference in the lives of all Belizeans and as Galen Eagles, we should aspire to continue building our country just like the father of the nation did. May the legacy of George Cadle Price live on!
