Different Perspectives: Train Maya

In this section of The Galen Times, we will discuss critical issues, challenges, and events that relate to Belize.

Let us look at Train Maya, a Mexican project, which could provide a major benefit to Belize and the tourism sector. The project is an <u>intercity</u> railway that will transport tourists throughout historical Maya monuments along with other renowned destinations in Mexico. The train will take off at Chiapas and head towards Cancun. Interestingly, the Prime Minister of Belize, John Briceno has proposed for Belize to be included as a destination on the Train Maya route, stopping off to drop tourists at the border. In an interview, PM Briceno explained that if Belize was to link with Train Maya, various facilities would be set up at the border where tourists would enter Belize. What facilities do you believe is needed in Corozal to attract tourists into our side of the border? If tourists enter Belize, what can the northern districts do to compete with popular destinations such as San Pedro and Caye Caulker? Do you think the Corozal seaside is an area where entrepreneurs can create a must see tourist destination?

Additionally, we know that apart from a beautiful destination, some tourists are looking for affordability. Therefore, do you see the possibility of Train Maya taking away tourists from Belize due to cheaper prices in Mexico? Do you believe that inflation will have a serious impact on the average tourist's decision to cross over to Belize? With this initiative, we see that Mexico and Belize are improving their bilateral relations and focusing on increasing economic activity in the region. Given that Train Maya will provide a new and exciting experience of the Maya sites, do you foresee Belizeans travelling to Mexico on the holidays instead of spending money locally? Interestingly, with Train Maya travelling close to our northern border, do you expect more hotels and restaurants to open up in Corozal and Orange Walk? If yes, how will this affect the competitive nature between tourists choosing to enter Belize or remaining in areas such as Chetumal or Cancun? Overall, how will this project affect our local tour guides, hotels, and other employees in the tourism sector? What can the Government of Belize along with the tourism sector do to remain competitive once Train Maya officially starts off?

Marijuana Referendum

Let us look at one of the popular and ongoing topics in Belize, the Marijuana Referendum. A referendum can be defined as a process where the voting population casts a vote on a critical decision in a country. Currently, that critical choice is whether the government should legalize marijuana and introduce the hemp industry in Belize. In 2017, the government amended the Misuse of Drugs Act which allows Belizeans, 18 years and older, to possess no more than ten grams of Marijuana on private premises. This amendment was the starting point for a widespread public discussion on the possibility of legalizing Marijuana in Belize and if it will provide economic benefits or social problems. Nevertheless, the Government of Belize (GOB) introduced a bill on July 2nd 2021 to formalize licensing, purchasing, and registration for cultivating and distributing cannabis goods. Immediately after GOB presented this bill, there was a surge of opinions presented on social media about the hemp industry in Belize. The government's position is that the hemp industry can provide new opportunities for economic growth in Belize while the Belize Council of Churches questions how the legalization of Marijuana will affect the youth population of Belize. What are some economic benefits and social problems that could arise from the legalization of Belize? Do you believe that the benefits outweigh the detriments of legalizing Marijuana? Moving on, the National Evangelical Association of Belize (NEAB) and the Belize Council of Churches attempted to trigger a referendum so that the voters can give their opinion on the Marijuana bill.

Since then, the churches have managed to collect 20 thousand signatures on their petition for a referendum and they have submitted it to the Governor General for review. Do you believe that a referendum should be done on the legalization of Marijuana, yes or no? Why do you take that position? If a referendum is called, what do you think will be the popular vote and why? Furthermore, we know that many gangs have had conflicts throughout the years because of marijuana and where it is sold. Therefore, do you foresee more or less turf wars with the legalization of marijuana? Interestingly, the legal aspects of a referendum must be considered as well. The Bar association of Belize has noted to the Belize Council of Churches and NEAB that a referendum decision does not obligate the government to make the decision that the people vote for. The results of the referendum will serve as a recommendation to the government from the people. In essence, do you believe that the government will act in accordance with the referendum results regardless if the outcome is not in their favored position? Ultimately, I ask, what is your position on the Marijuana Legalization bill?




